## Assessment Task One Questions

1. In 2,000 words or less, develop a process to review a particular policy advice proposal in the interest of Māori. Please ensure that your process:
  - Identifies government's objectives and principles for the policy area you have chosen, particularly as it relates to Māori
  - Identifies key indicators which provide outcome measures for the policy's target group (s)
  - Incorporates findings from empirical research and data associated with the policy
  - Establishes the importance of various aspects of how the policy proposal was developed
  - When developed, contains any other key points where the issues and the impact on Māori, need to be addressed.

NOTE: There are a range of aspects that you may want to consider. This range includes but is not limited to – how widely consultation was conducted, a needs analysis, which particular agencies were involved, use of existing data, emphasis given to implications for Māori and the time taken to develop the proposal

2. In terms of reviewing a policy advice proposal that seeks to meet the needs of Māori. In 2,000 words or less please select a policy advice proposal which seeks to meet or address the needs of Māori. Please ensure that your review:
  - Is consistent with adopted process criteria
  - Analyses the strengths and weaknesses of the adopted process in relation to the Treaty of Waitangi and Government's objectives and intended outcomes for Māori
  - Identifies strengths and weaknesses of the proposal in relation to the Treaty of Waitangi and Government's objectives and intended outcomes for Māori
  - Makes recommendations to adjust or add to the proposal where necessary to improve responsiveness in relation to the Treaty of Waitangi and Government's objectives and intended outcomes for Māori
  - Includes any other strategies you deem necessary and where they also add value to the review.
